PRE-CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS

- A. COUNSELING FOR GROWTH: WORKING EFFECTIVELY WITH EARLY ADOLESCENTS AND THEIR PARENTS**
 Presenters: Ruth McSwain, Consultant, Wilmington, NC
 Jerry Yarrill, Coordinator of Student Guidance Services, Jefferson County, Colorado
- This program will focus on (1) helping counselors understand the needs of the adolescent student; and (2) assisting counselors in their work with the parents of early adolescents by providing ideas and activities that can be used to foster the collaborative efforts of the school and parents.
- B. ADLERIAN PSYCHOLOGY AND PRACTICE IN COUNSELING**
 Presenter: Dr. Al Milliren, Professor, Counseling Education, Illinois State University, Normal, Ill.
- This workshop will give an in-depth examination of the theory and techniques of Adlerian Psychology. Topics covered include family constellation, birth order, goals of misbehavior, encouragement, social interest, class/family councils, life-style assessment, and the process of family counseling.

- The purpose of this workshop is to acquaint counselors with a model for organizing and managing individual counseling cases. It is intended for each participant to: (1) learn and apply a method for planning, implementing, and evaluating individual counseling; and (2) learn a procedure for documenting case progress. A comprehensive workbook containing detailed information about each step of the case management process, will be included.
